The Council has increased the Parish Precept by 2% for 2018/19 but due to the number of new houses in the Parish the Parish Rate will remain at £36.15 for a Band D property.

Planning applications are no longer available to view in the Parish Office. All applications can be viewed at



Crimes need to be reported to the Police

The Council has received a number of complaints about an increase in crime and anti social behaviour around the Parish.

The Police report crime statistics to the Council monthly and it would appear that not all crimes are reported to the Police.

Residents are encouraged to report crime, anti social behaviour or suspicious activity to ensure that the level of the policing in the Parish reflects the level of criminal activity.

You should call 101 to report crime and other concerns that do not require an emergency response. For example, if:

- Your car has been stolen
- Your property has been damaged
- You suspect drug use or dealing in your neighbourhood

Or to:

- Give the police information about crime in your area
- Speak to the police about a general enquiry

You should always call 999 when it is an emergency, such as when a crime is in progress, someone suspected of a crime is nearby, when there is danger to life or when violence is being used or threatened.
