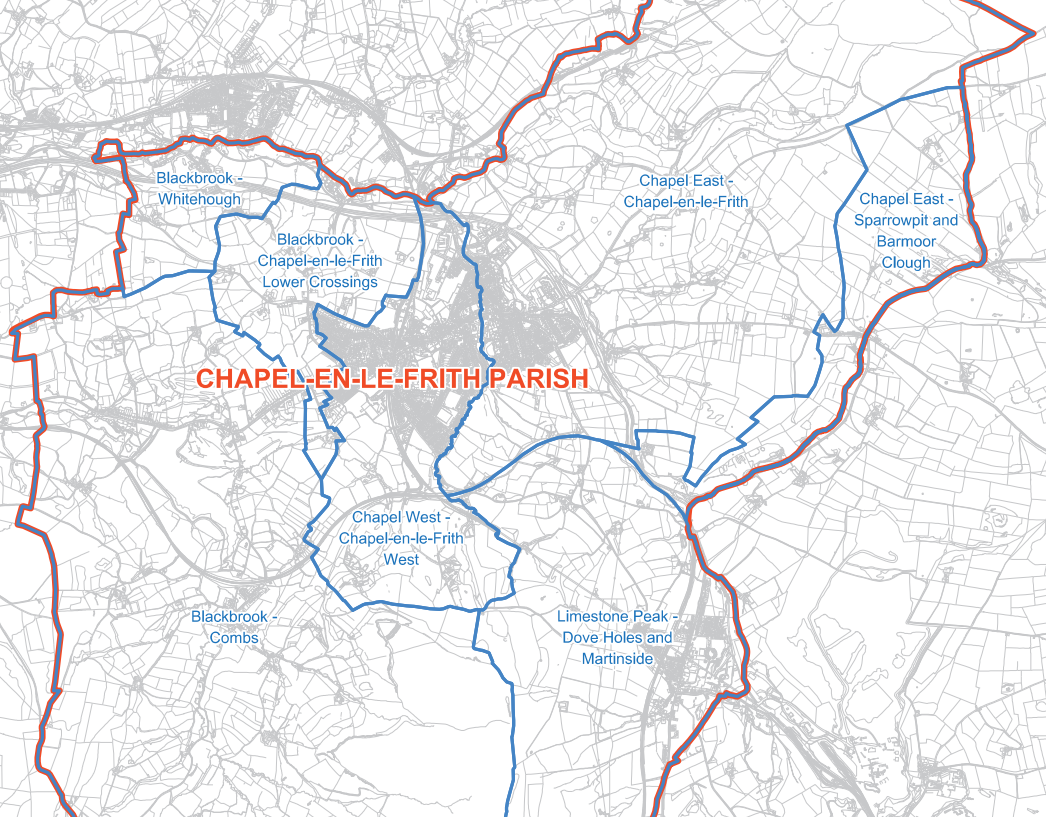

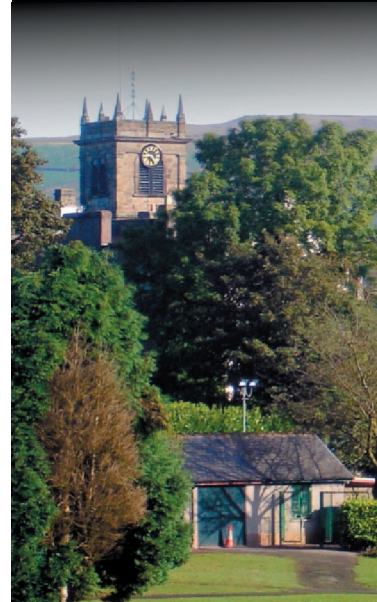

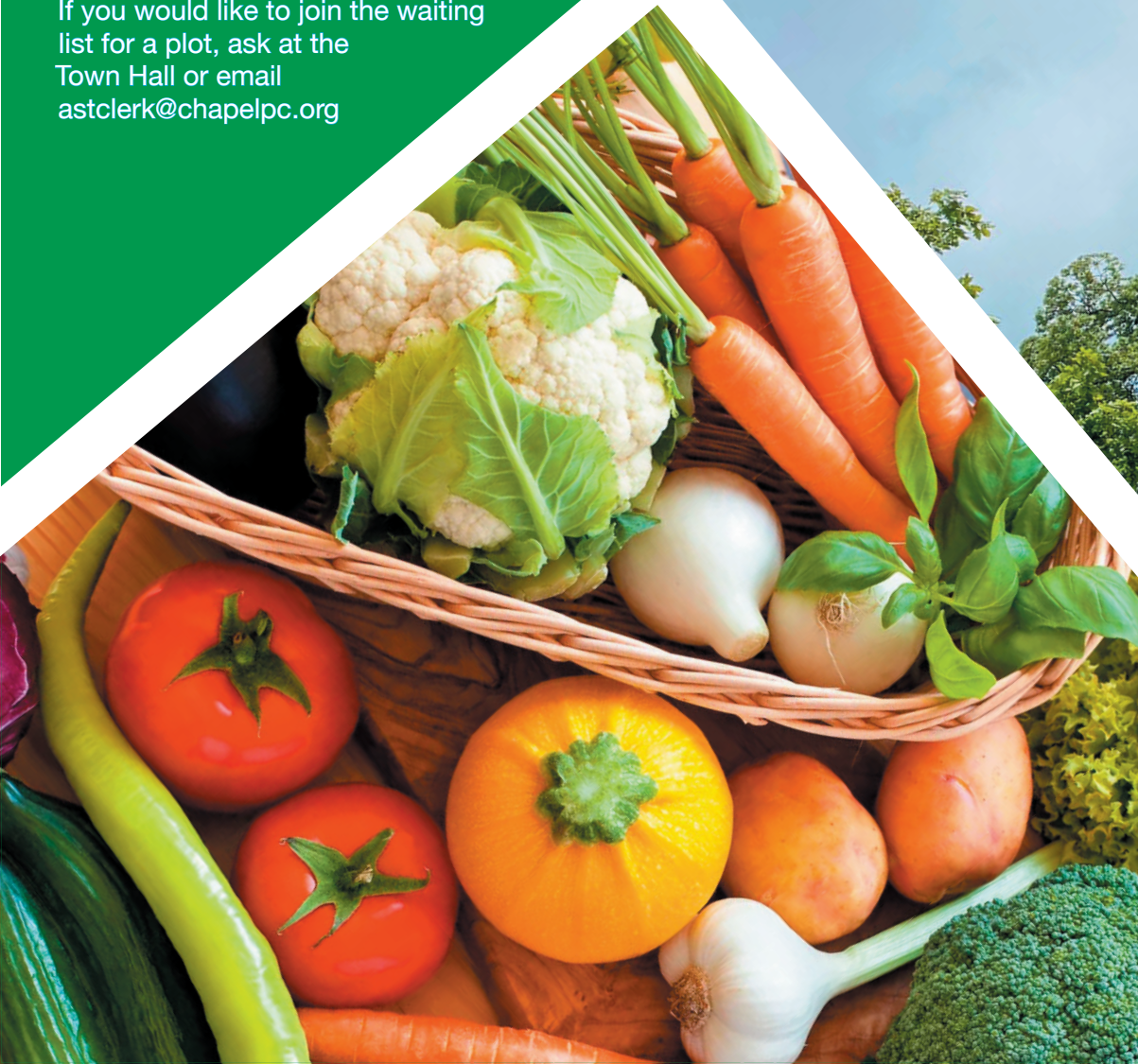

# CHAPEL ALLOTMENTS

The Parish Council has been working over the past year to re-open the Leys Allotments, after a successful campaign to prevent their sale. The allotments, accessed from the tramway on Sheffield Road, were first opened in 1919 as a way for local families to grow fresh fruit and vegetables. The allotments were heavily overgrown, and had become a target for fly-tipping.
